SERMON DISCUSSION WEEK 4

Quotable Moments:

- If you don't understand how we got the Bible, you'll misunderstand what's in the Bible.
- If you don't know the story of the Bible, it's easy to dismiss the stories in the Bible.

Key Things You Heard:

- The apostle Paul explains the relationship between the Jewish Scriptures and what Jesus did.
- Apostle Paul advice #1: Read the Old Testament for information and inspiration, but not for application.
- Apostle Paul advice #2: Take your application cue from Jesus' new covenant command for you.
- Christianity was created by an event that launched a movement that produced documents that were collected and protected and eventually bound together in a book.

Questions for Group Discussion:

Why is that question more important than being at peace with everything in the Bible? Talk about how Matthew, Mark, Luke, John, or Paul would answer this question?
