#### **Key Things You Heard:**

- History is the story of God moving and proving His love for you.
- Be your own king -- and you'll end up with a king
  -- not of your liking.
- In the middle of this dark period in history, when everybody was doing what was right in their own eyes, God was not absent.
- When Mary had her child -- no one believed this was an ordinary birth.

**Pray:** Jesus, thank you for the story of redeeming grace. Thank you for including the story of Ruth in our Bible – to show a story of redemption, in the middle of preparing the lineage of Jesus. Thank you for the story of Jesus at Christmas. Thank you for redeeming my life and giving me a relationship with my Heavenly Father. Help me to follow you. In Jesus' name, Amen.

- What next step of obedience is God prompting you to take? Would you open up your life to His unconditional love, acceptance, and leadership?
- Spend prayer time expressing gratitude for God's redeeming grace in your life. Thank Him for the gift of salvation and for how He is redeeming your story.
